Philanthropist Elizabeth Knox leaves bequest for the creation of a hospital & home for the poor, suffering incurable diseases

The Knox Home Trust Board was formed, a hospital built and from 1914, began its valuable work in Auckland city including receiving injured World War 1 veterans.

Knox was granted recognition as a hospital accepting sick & wounded soldiers returning from World War 2

Move to brand new facility closer to Auckland city

Knox was a traditionally operated rest home and hospital.
